Cause of death after autopsy was mentioned as asphyxia due to hanging with a ligature material. In view of this, answer the following:

- 2B. Explain the findings indicative of an antemortem nature of hanging.
- 2C. Comment on the sitting position in which the body was found.
- 2D. What would be the additional descriptive features that can be inferred about the ligature mark base on the above description?
