- 1C. Mention principles of treatment of above two differential diagnosis.

His examination reveals a right scalene lymph node, distended neck veins and grade III clubbing. Respiratory system examination reveals tracheal shift to right side, flattening of right infraclavicular area with absent breath sounds.
- 2A. Mention the complete clinical diagnosis.
- 2B. Explain his symptoms and signs based on his pathology.
- 2C. How to confirm the diagnosis? Also mention the treatment of this patient in brief.

- 3A. 18-year-old male patient presents with h/o smoky urine of 1 week duration. He had a skin ulcer 2 weeks before it. Mention the most probable diagnosis with reasons. Mention two investigations and two complications of this condition.
- 3B. A patient of pneumonia became drowsy while being treated. His serum sodium was 110 m.eq/l and urine spot sodium 30 m.eq/l. Mention the most probable cause of his electrolyte abnormality. How to treat this electrolyte disorder?
- 3C. Describe the actions of heparin and coumadin with examples of potential use.
- 3D. Mention the cause of painless genital sores with inguinal lymph node in an young man. How to treat this condition?
- 3E. Describe the life cycle of strongyloides stercoralis and mention its treatment.
- 3F. Mention investigations to be carried out in all newly diagnosed hypertensive patients with reasons for the same.
