- 1C. If we do an indirect ophthalmoscopy in this patient what are the changes expected to be seen? (4)
- 1D. What are the various modalities of treatment available to treat this boy? (2)
- 2. A 60 year old patient comes to the OPD with sudden pain and drop in vision in the right eye after coming out of a movie theatre half an hour ago. She gives history of similar episodes in the past towards evening time. She gives history of colored haloes and pain at the brow. She also has vomiting sensation after the pain started today.


3A) If the facial nerve is damaged during parotidectomy what is the lid abnormality seen? What will be the clinical features in the eye and how will you manage? (1+3)

- 3B) What are the differential diagnosis for a limbal nodule? How will you manage a phlycten. (2+2)
- 3C) Give 4 differential diagnosis for focal congestion in the eye. How will you evaluate and treat nodular Scleritis? (2+2)
- 3D) A 25 year old male comes to the OPD with complaints of irritation and pricking sensation of the right eyes since 3 days. This was associated with redness and watering of the eye. He gives history of burning sensation over the forehead on the right side, with some fluid filled lesions on the fore head since 5 days. History of blurring of vision since one day is also present.



What is the diagnosis? What are the other clinical spectrum of this condition? (1+3=4)

- 3J) Name the two oblique extraocular muscles and their primary action along with their innervation. (2+2=4 marks)
- 3K) During Phaco emulsification there was a large posterior capsular rupture and the patient was left aphakic. What are the visual rehabilitation choices available for this patient? If not rehabilitated what are the visual disturbances seen in this patient? (4)
- 3L) A 25 year old boy came with complaints of night blindness and history of similar complaints in his brothers too.
